## Bishop Maurice D. Bingham Youth of the Year Award College Level

## To Qualify:

- 1. Participant must be a born again Christian.
- 2. Participant must be in good standing with the Church of Christ (Holiness) U.S.A. with a letter from his or her pastor.
- 3. Participant must be active in Sunday School and Holiness Youth Ministries.
- 4. Participant must register on the opening day of the Congress.
- 5. Participant must have completed his or her freshman year of college and cannot be over 23 years old.
- 6. Participant must maintain a grade point average of at least 3.00. A copy of participant's college transcript must accompany his or her application.
- 7. Participant must have contributed to volunteer efforts in his or her community.
- 8. Participant must be present at the Congress session so that he or she may be recognized in person.
- 9. Participant must submit a resume which shall include spiritual, academic and occupational or professional goals.
- 10. Participant must be willing to give back to his or her local church and community.
- 11. Participant must submit an  $8 \times 10$  color photograph (to be displayed at the National Congress as directed by the National Youth of the Year Coordinator).
- 12. Participant will be interviewed by Youth of the Year Committee.
- 13. Participant shall submit typed documents. Handwritten documents will not be accepted.
- 14. Participant may submit a portfolio, or typed summary of current year awards and achievements.
- 15. A winner of the National Youth of the Year, College Level, may not participate in the contest again.
- 16. Each participant must submit a type written essay 300 to 500 words on the current Congress theme.

## Recognitions

- 1. The Youth of the Year representative from each diocese will receive a plaque.
- 2. All participants on both the high school and college levels will be evaluated and considered for National Youth of the Year recognition.
- 3. The National Youth of the Year, High School Level, shall receive a service award in the form of a \$500 scholarship.
- 4. The National Youth of the Year, College Level, shall receive a service award in the form of a \$500 scholarship.
- 5. National Youth of the Year recipients for both high school and college levels shall make a short presentation during the Congress at a time designated by the President of the National Sunday School & HYM Congress.

## **Procedures for the Committee**

- 1. The Interviewing Committee must interview each Participant.
- 2. The Interviewing Committee, when interviewing, may consider hardship cases of participants who cannot attend the National Congress.
