Why do you believe it is important to have a mission statement for your ministry?

Built around two passages.....

The Great Commandment: Jesus replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is lie it "Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." -(Matt. 22:37-40)

The Great Commission: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have command you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." -(Matt. 28:19-20)

Worship

Worship is celebrating God's presence and honoring him with our lifestyles.

"Love your neighbor as yourself" is a call to

Ministry

Ministry is demonstrating God's love by meeting the needs of others with love.

"Go and make disciples of all nations" is a called to....

Evangelism

Evangelism is communicating the good news of Jesus Christ with those who don't yet know Him personally.

"Baptizing them" (incorporating them into the body of believers) is a call to.....

Fellowship

Fellowship is incorporating God's people into a family where they can be known, cared for, held accountable, and encouraged.

"Teaching them to obey" is a call to....

Discipleship

Discipleship is educating God's people with the truth.

Fellowship - Ministry -Evangelism -Worship -Discipleship

To equip(discipleship) the youth to share (evangelism) the gospel through real conversations (fellowship) while living a <u>lifestyle</u> (worship) of <u>purpose</u> (ministry).
