

Friday's Speaker: Pastor Arlandis D. Powell

Elder Arlandis Powell lives and breathes his faith daily in what he acknowledges as a living testimony, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ." While in Mississippi he became a member and served on the ministerial staff at New Lake COCHUSA, in Jackson, MS under the leadership of former pastor Elder Eddie Brown. He served in that capacity for 4 ½ years.

He also holds the position as the District Chairman of the Northern District of the Western Diocese. Elder Powell is married to the love of his life, Sis. Tameka Farr-Powell. The SCHOOL Needs the CHURCH!

A great principal cannot lead a successful school without a key ingredient quality teachers. Results from Educators for Excellence Voices from the Classroom 2023 Survey found four major things that teachers want. They want leaders to examine factors for retention and recruitment, increased salaries, provide better benefits, and more respect for their profession from society.

As a school leader, raising the teacher's salary and providing better benefits was outside of my locus of control. What I could control was how I valued them and respected them as educators and people. One way I did that was through our master schedule; giving them a longer lunch and planning period. I also fed them on days when they had to stay past contractual hours for school events. These small gestures meant something to them. With COVID money drying up, school leaders may not have additional funds in their budget to show appreciation for their teachers in the same way.


This provides a wonderful opportunity for local churches to step in!

Each month your church could provide monthly treats as a thank you. Treats can be as simple as donuts and orange juice or fun and fancy like an ice cream bar to welcome them back or a hot chocolate bar when winter arrives. Your church could also sponsor a catered lunch or dinner for holidays. If supporting the school is too much, consider adopting a first year teacher or a teacher who is new to your city. Additionally, you can ease their pockets by supporting the children. Churches can adopt families for the holidays or provide uniforms and school supplies to families in need.

If your church does not have the funds to support, you can always give the gift of time. If the school allows visitors, volunteer for lunch or recess duty. Make copies for a teacher or replace bulletin boards. Come in weekly for story time and give the teacher a 15–20 minute break on a Friday!

Most importantly, pray for them without ceasing! Educators are passionate and invested, but as we commonly say among each other, "Baby, we tired!"

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First Church Cares: Houston, TX

First COCHUSA-Houston, under the leadership of Elder Rodney E. Magee prayed for opportunities to serve our church community; not just an annual event where we conducted our 'churchly duties' for the community; but for services we could provide that would make a genuine and lasting difference.

In 2018, we began an alliance with John E. Codwell Elementary School of the Houston Independent School District; which is near First Church and has over 400 PreK - 5th grade students, 50 teachers, and

First Church joined the Community Council; a community partnership that works with the school; we met with Codwell's Wraparound Resource Specialist (who involves the community for the betterment of the student); and we attend the school's Shared Decision-Making Committee meetings.

In our initial meeting, the principal identified the greatest need was toiletries. That is where we started.

However, we noticed the teachers really needed uplifting. We felt if the teachers were supported, the students would be the beneficiaries. We prayed about funding and sustainability. In February 2022, we applied for and were awarded a COCHUSA Local Church Evangelism Grant. We immediately began serving the teachers at Codwell.

Each Monday, we provide a Teacher Care Cart. The Cart is placed in the teacher's lounge and contains hot breakfast sandwiches, fruit, Granola bars, popcorn, juice, water, and other snacks and a prayer card. Teacher Care Crew members are present to greet the staff and offer words of encouragement. Prayer requests are taken and prayed for prior to leaving the school; and prayed for during Sunday service.

The Crew of volunteers consists of retirees, members working full time, and college students.

First Church also participates in activities throughout the school year; including Literacy Week, Open House, Fall Festival; any opportunity to interact with parents and students.

This 2023-2024 school year, we expanded our 'reach' by providing extra sets of much needed and requested uniforms.

The Teacher Care Cart is funded by generous member donations, monetary pledges of friends, the COCHUSA Evangelistic Grant and the Mustard Seed Foundation. We can truly attest to 'all that we've needed, His Hand has provided.'

We pray that our Light at Codwell will be a positive influence in the lives of the students, parents, and staff. Our prayer is to continue this service at Codwell and expand to middle and high schools in our church community. We are determined to make a difference.










